EDITORIAL From Gain of Function to Gain of Wisdom

A number of years ago, our President Bernard Carr organised a meeting in Cambridge on the multiverse, where Prof Keith Ward from Oxford was commenting on Richard Dawkins's assertion that religions are dangerous. No, he said, it's human beings who are dangerous.

There has been much debate about the origins of Covid-19 and many competing narratives around the inherent uncertainties. The overall context, however, is clear: it is the so-called gain of function (GOF) research where the object is to enhance the deadliness and transmissibility of a virus. The Wuhan Laboratory is one of the leading facilities in this respect, and has received research grants from the US National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID). The Obama administration suspended this research for safety reasons in 2014, but it was reinstated with new guidelines in 2017.

The research rationale is preventative and defensive: the need to know how to prevent pandemics and defend yourself against enemy intent. However, for the putative enemy, your biosecurity is potentially a cover for the development of offensive bioweapons. Kenneth Bernard, a biodefence expert, puts it like this: 'Defending against biothreats by developing countermeasures looks a lot like an offensive bioweapons programme' to some countries.

The result is that each country projects their own fear and shadow on the other. As with nuclear deterrence, the logic is one of mutually assured destruction (MAD). However, genuine security can only arise from the building of trust, which includes trust by the people in the integrity of their

governments. This is where a culture of secrecy comes in. Intelligence services around the world pursue covert operations on behalf of their governments on the basis of 'plausible deniability'. If people actually knew everything that is going on behind the scenes, they would undoubtedly protest and governments could not continue this kind of activity that they regard essential to their national interests.

The same secrecy/transparency dilemma applies to gain of function research. There is a worldwide community of virologists whose livelihoods depend on its continuation and who naturally do not want to see the applecart upended. These same people sit on government advisory panels like the US National Science Advisory Board for Biosecurity (NSABB). They fear that if the review process is opened up

to the scrutiny of ethicists, scientists and the general public, then the whole project will grind to a halt and all the high security BSL labs will be closed down. Hence, the incentive to keep things confidential on a need-to-know basis.


Such closure would be amply justified simply on the basis of the precautionary principle, which we use in defence but not yet for environmental security, despite many years of advocacy. On ethical grounds, this is surely a collective imperative, as advocated by Francis Boyle, a lawyer involved in drafting bioweapons legislation. He is adamant that all BSL3 and BSL4 laboratories must be closed down and all biowarfare work with lethal pathogens ceased. 'They are all existentially dangerous,' he says. 'This is a catastrophe waiting to happen. And it is now happened.'

It's time for us as a species to address our collective shadows, fears and mistrust. As Dr Andrew Powell remarks: 'Covid-19 may be the bullet but, of course, we, the human species, created the gun.' Let's reframe the terms of the discussion beyond gain of function and start addressing gain of wisdom instead. To quote Deuteronomy: 'I have set before you life and death, blessings and curses. Now choose life, so that you and your children may live.'

Suzanne Taylor: <u>Kindness is Coming</u> <u>into Vogue</u>





Frank Furedi: A Disaster without Precedent

Prof Frank Furedi is a sociologist and social commentator who is Emeritus Professor of Sociology at the University of Kent, and is widely cited for his views on the difficulties of engaging with risk and uncertainty. <u>Here</u> he argues that Covid-19 is a disaster without precedent – not primarily in terms of the disease itself, but in terms of how we have responded to it.

'The impact of Covid-19 on people's lives and on economic, social and global relations, both now and in the future, is likely to be more far-reaching than any other previous public-health crisis. Not even during the First World War or the Second World War did governments feel the need to close schools. The application of emergency measures in response to Covid-19 is unparalleled in peacetime.' Full article <u>here</u>.

Deepak Chopra: Is Reincarnation Actually Real?

In this interesting article, Deepak Chopra quotes a recent poll where 33% of Americans report a belief in reincarnation. He points out that in modern secular society, the question of survival of bodily death has been channelled into belief vs science, a framework that he finds unhelpful as a 'false divide'. He points out that a great deal of credible research on the topic has been carried out at the University of Virginia (we have Jim Tucker giving a talk on this in the autumn), proposing that 'if everything is recycling under the influence of creativity, memory and imagination, it seems very likely that human consciousness participates in the same recycling' – an intriguing thought.
