





Presenter	Biography
Liam Bureau	Liam is a student studying Interdisciplinary Liberal Arts, Spanish, and Environmental Sustainability at Colorado State University. Liam grew up in a small town in Alaska with a population of 150 and attended a K-12 school of 20 through high school. Liam grew up travelling often, which softened his transition to the 'outside world' when he moved to Colorado for school. Since moving, Liam has become involved in community engagement work on and off campus. One of the most baffling parts of this transition has been witnessing people's attitudes towards their surroundings, and how those attitudes dictate their treatment of the world. Liam's first inclination has been to call others out and be generally angry, but that hasn't done much. More recently, Liam has been trying to spend more energy focusing on who he is and what a real contribution would look like. Liam plans to design and carry out a public intergenerational dialogue on the environmental crisis. Next spring, during his final semester of his undergraduate degree, Liam will complete his honors thesis. This is an open-ended project that Liam can shape into whatever he can justify as an appropriate intersection between personal interests and a product that could help the wider community. At this symposium, Liam will be presenting a poster that outlines this planned project and receive feedback on how to make it happen successfully and practically.
Elisabeth Carrio	After studying political science, and economics, Elisabeth worked as an independent CPA for around twenty years. At 44, she decided to work for international organizations (UN, OSCE, European Commission, etc.) and then travelled extensively worldwide as a consultant in finance, governance and change management. Her first experiences in this politico-diplomatic world was more focused on power struggles than the well-being of populations, and this led her to resume her studies in psychology. Elisabeth is now assisting people and organizations in their quest for meaning as an existential and transpersonal coach and as a hypnotherapist. She is a third-year student in transpersonal psychology at Alef Trust (LJMU). She has also published various books: a novel, a political essay and books on spiritual intelligence. Her main subjects of interest are kabbalistic psychology and Astro psychology.
Degard	Degard is a pioneering British Visionary artist and 'Painter of Auras and founder of the genre Contemporary Visionary. Degard sees auras in and around people, animals, places and things.
